Further to our recent call, I am writing to advise of GTA's decision to withdraw from further formal involvement in the oversight and governance of Grains Australia Limited (GAL).

The GTA Board has considered this matter carefully and canvassed widely with its membership base.

We remain very proud of the work we have done with GRDC, GPA and GGL in the establishment of GAL, including the development of the GAL Constitution, the appointment of the inaugural skills-based Board, and the successful transitioning of Wheat Quality Australia to GAL's control.

Now GAL is up and running, we see that it is time to step back and re-focus our efforts in supporting the interests of our Members. This will also let GAL focus on delivering value to growers. Ultimately value generated by a successful GAL will flow overwhelmingly to growers which benefits the Australian grains industry as a whole.

In practical terms GTA will stand down from:

- a) The GAL Advisory Committee; and
- b) The GAL Director Selection Committee.

We would also be grateful if GAL would cease referring to GTA and using our brand in its promotional materials and activities.

Going forward, GTA expects to work with GAL to identify collaboration opportunities for the benefit of the entire Australian grain value chain.

GTA will continue to work in delivering value to our Members. Most of the time we anticipate this will be aligned to the interests of growers and GAL, but not always. We see this as natural and desirable.

We will work collaboratively with all stakeholders, including GAL and governments, as we have always done.

In the interests of transparency, GTA intends this to be an open letter for circulation to its Members and other stakeholders.
